



Code of Conduct

For the Olympic Boxing Qualifying Events and the
Boxing Tournament at the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) hereby requests your agreement, in your capacity as a Boxing Competition Official, Team Official or Boxing Athlete, to the following Code of Conduct and the IOC Code of Ethics, which will apply for as long as you are participating or officiating in any competition under the authority of the IOC.

Integrity

- Article 1** I shall ensure that my conduct may not in any manner tarnish the reputation of the sport of boxing or the IOC.
- Article 2** I shall respect all Event Regulations for the Olympic Boxing Qualifying Events and the boxing tournament at the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020.
- Article 3** I shall not collude or collaborate with any party by violating any rule of sport or the IOC Code of Ethics.
- Article 4** I shall always conduct myself in a professional manner, respecting the Technical Delegate and all officials and competitors.
- Article 5** I shall not in any circumstances, directly or indirectly, solicit, accept or offer any form of remuneration or commission, nor any concealed benefit, service or gift of any nature that could be considered as a bribe or undue influence.
- Article 6** I shall not bet on any boxing competition and any event at the Olympic Games.
- Article 7** I shall not share inside information¹ at any time and in any circumstances.

Reporting Obligations

- Article 8** I must immediately report any approaches or offers, such as those described under Articles 5, 6 and 7, to the IOC Boxing Task Force by sending an email to info@olympicboxing.sport.

Harassment

- Article 9** I shall not enter into any form of harassment and abuse, be it physical, professional or sexual, and cause or instigate any physical injuries outside of competition or mental injuries.
- Article 10** I shall not discriminate against anyone on the basis of race, colour, religion, gender, age, national origin, disability or sexual orientation.

¹ "Inside information" refers to any type of information relating to any competition or competitors that a person possesses by virtue of his/her position in relation to boxing competitions or boxers, excluding any information already published or of common knowledge.

Boxing Code of Conduct

Responsibilities of Boxing Competition Officials

- Article 11** Any information deemed confidential I may receive from the IOC or may learn in the course of my duties as a Boxing Competition Official must remain confidential and must not be disclosed.
- Article 12** I shall not socialise with or become intimate or enter into any relationship with Boxers and/or Coaches and Seconds and/or other team delegation members. I shall not behave in any way which shall cast doubt on my impartiality as a Boxing Competition Official.
- Article 13** In the event that I have any type of relationship with Boxers and/or Coaches and Seconds and/or other team delegation members, I must immediately disclose this relationship(s) to the IOC Boxing Task Force in writing to info@olympicboxing.sport. I accept in advance that, due to this relationship(s), I may not be allowed to officiate as a Boxing Competition Official.
- Article 14** I shall fulfil my missions at the highest level. For all competitions, I shall never take biased decisions impacting the course or the outcome of the competition.
- Article 15** I shall not communicate with anybody about any competition-related issue within the Competition Venue and/or any other location for the entire period of the competition and afterwards, especially to persons from my own country such as National Federation members, Executive Committee members, the media and the public. I shall not comment about any competition-related issue on social media.
- Article 16** I shall be on time for all competition duties assigned to me.
- Article 17** I shall be available to attend any Boxing Competition Officials' meetings on or before the Competition days.
- Article 18** I shall fulfil all duties assigned to me by the Technical Delegate.
- Article 19** I shall not use or carry any electronic communication device, including but not limited to a mobile phone, a laptop and a tablet computer, inside the Competition Venue. Exceptionally, the R&J Evaluators and the Observers may use laptops to perform their official duties.
- Article 20** I shall always maintain a professional appearance when performing my duties as a Boxing Competition Official.
- Article 21** I shall not criticise or attempt to explain calls or decisions made by any Boxing Competition Official, including myself, unless requested by the Technical Delegate to do so.
- Article 22** I shall not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, which will alter my judgement, while officiating or participating in any IOC Boxing Task Force competitions, including all related meetings and weigh-ins.
- Article 23** I shall not smoke in the Competition Venue or any area not designated for smoking.

Interpretation and Sanctions

- Article 24** I agree to be bound by this Code of Conduct as well as the IOC Code of Ethics, and acknowledge that any infringement of this Code of Conduct or the IOC Code of Ethics may be referred to the IOC Chief Ethics and Compliance Officer and may lead to disciplinary measures and sanctions taken against me.
