Basic COVID-19 Countermeasures

- Wear a face mask at all times
- Wash your hands regularly and use hand sanitiser where available
- Keep two metres' distance from athletes and at least one metre from others, including in operational spaces
- Avoid physical contact, such as hugging, high-fives, handshakes, etc.
- Disinfect your hands when entering each area and room
- Do not share towels, drink bottles or other equipment
- Disinfect your hands before and after using equipment
- Keep your stay at the venue as short as possible

Pre-competition Activities in the Olympic Village

Boxing Sport Entries Check in the Olympic Village

- Follow any guidelines applied to the Olympic Village

Daily Weigh-ins and Medical Checks in the Olympic Village

- Follow any guidelines applied to the Olympic Village.
- Athletes may take off their mask while mounted on scales and when a doctor asks them to do so.
- Specific time slots will be allocated by the IOC Boxing Task Force (BTF) for each boxer to attend the Daily Weigh-ins and Medical checks. The schedule will be posted on the evening prior to each daily weigh-in in the Sports Information Center (SIC) and INFO.

Pre-competition Activities in the Kokugikan Arena

Technical Meeting and Official Draw in the Kokugikan Arena

- Follow any guidelines applied to the venue
- Two representatives per team are allowed to participate

Pre-Bout Activities in the Kokugikan Arena

Session pass check

- Teams are allowed to enter a Back of House area 1 hour 15 minutes prior to their respective bouts provided they are holders of the relevant session pass.
- If teams come to the session pass check point earlier than 1 hour 15 minutes prior to their bouts, they are asked to either wait or go to the same discipline athlete seats.

Athlete check-in desk

- Athletes receive towels to prevent from sharing towels.

Warm up area

- NOC officials must wear a mask at all times.
- Athletes have the option to take off their mask while warming up.
- Athletes are required to wear a mask when they go to any other area outside of the warm-up area, including while waiting in the last call area.
- Before grabbing any refreshment, teams are required to use hand sanitizer.
- Sanitizers are available for disinfecting sport equipment. Team members can disinfect sport equipment prior to their use. The Tokyo 2020 boxing team will disinfect all equipment regularly.

Pre-Bout Activities in the Kokugikan Arena

Last Call Area

- NOC officials must wear a mask all the times.
- Athletes may take off their mask before they enter the FOP
- Surgical gloves are given to coaches at the warm-up areas or final call area. Coaches wear surgical gloves before they enter the FOP.

FOP in the Kokugikan Arena

- NOC officials must wear a mask at all times.
- After a bout, seconds must make sure to bring their belonging with them. Flag Bearers and/or Corner Assistants will remind seconds to take their belonging when leaving the FOP.

Post-Bout Activities in the Kokugikan Arena

- On the way back to the BOH, seconds must throw away the surgical gloves in a specific garbage bin and apply hand sanitizer.
- After their bout, teams are encouraged to leave the BOH as soon as possible.

Guideline for TOs

FOP

- TOs must always wear a mask.
- Referees must wear a mask even during officiating a bout.
- All TOs should clean their table and chair with a disinfectant cloth (provided at the table) before they sit to work.
- Referees must wear surgical gloves while on the ring. They put the gloves on before entering the FOP. After the end of the respective bout, on the way back to their lounge, they throw away the gloves in a specific garbage bin and apply hand sanitizer.
- Judges clean their table and chair with a disinfectant cloth on their table before they use.

Guideline for TOs

FOP

- Time-keepers and gong-operators must wear surgical gloves. They wear the gloves before entering the FOP. After session endings, on the way back to their lounge, they must throw away the gloves in a specific garbage bin and apply hand sanitizer.
- Time-keepers and gong-operators must clean their equipment before and after usage with disinfectant cloth provided on their table.
- Time-keepers and gong-operators must clean their table and chairs before and after usage with disinfectant cloth provided on their table.

Guideline for TOs

Lounge

- TOs must wear mask at all times, except when eating or drinking.
- Maintain social distance (at least 1 m) between chairs.
- Before grabbing any refreshment, TOs are required to use hand sanitizer.
- Follow any specific measures applied the caterers.
- Must not talk while eating or drinking.

Training Venue

- Team delegation members must wear a mask at all times.
- Team delegations are allowed to train only in the designated training area on the third floor, allocated by Tokyo2020 Boxing competition team.
- Athletes have the option to take off their mask while training in the designated spaces.
- The additional area on the second floor dedicated to boxers in training area exclusively for post-training cool-down. The wearing of masks are mandatory in this area.
- The Tokyo 2020 Boxing team will determine the maximum number of people in one training area on the third floor.
- The training schedule allocation by Tokyo 2020 Boxing competition team must be respected by team delegations.
- Sanitizers are located for disinfecting sport equipment. Team delegation members may disinfect the sport equipment prior to their use. The sport equipment and furniture found in the training areas are disinfected in between training sessions by the Tokyo 2020 Boxing team staff.
- No sparring between different Team Delegation members
